Welcome to St George's! This booklet contains all the material you will need for today's celebration of Mass. We hope you will find this service easy to follow, but please also do not be afraid to ask if you are unsure what to do at any point. The building is fitted with an Induction Loop - sit away from the pillars for best results!

Families with small children are very welcome to make use of the carpeted area at the back of church, where you will find books, crayons and soft toys. There are two further play stations in the side aisles. Older children are invited to join Children's Church, who assemble at the far end of the north (left-hand) aisle.

A toilet is at the back of church behind the screen. After Mass, please join us in the hall for refreshments. Before Mass, please try to maintain an atmosphere of quiet prayer.

Mass setting: Congress Mass.

Please <u>stand</u> when the bell rings, for the procession of the clergy and servers, and to sing hymn REH **191**:

Holy, Holy! Lord God Almighty! Early in the morning our song shall rise to thee; Holy, Holy, Holy! Merciful and mighty! God in three Persons, blessèd Trinity!

Holy, Holy! all the saints adore thee, Casting down their golden crowns around the glassy sea; Cherubim and seraphim falling down before thee, Who wert, and art, and evermore shalt be.

Holy, Holy! though the darkness hide thee, Though the eye of sinful man thy glory may not see, Only thou art holy, there is none beside thee Perfect in power, in love, and purity.

All thy works shall praise thy name, in earth, and sky, and sea;

Remain <u>standing</u> to sing the Gloria

People Glory to God, Glory to God in the highest, and peace, peace to his people on earth. Lord God, heavenly King,

almighty God and Father, we worship you, we give you thanks, we praise you for your glory. Lord Jesus Christ, only Son of the Father. Lord God, Lamb of God, you take away the sin of the world, have mercy on us; you are seated at the right hand of the Father, receive our

prayer. For you alone are the Holy One, you alone are

the Lord, you alone are the Most High, Jesus Christ, with the Holy Spirit, in the glory of God the Father. Amen.

Then the Priest prays the Collect,

God our Father, who by sending into the world the Word of truth and the Spirit of sanctification made known to the human race your wondrous mystery, grant us, we pray, that in professing the true faith, we may acknowledge the Trinity of eternal glory and adore your Unity, powerful in majesty. Through our Lord Jesus Christ, your Son, who lives and reigns with you in the unity of the Holy Spirit, God, for ever and ever.

Now <u>sit</u> to listen to the First Reading. (Proverbs 8; 22-31).

Reader A reading from the book of Proverbs.

Thus says the Wisdom of God: The Lord possessed me at the beginning of his work, the first of his acts of old. Ages ago I was set up, at the first, before the beginning of the earth. When there were no depths I was brought forth, when there were no springs abounding with water. Before the mountains had been shaped, before the hills, I was brought forth, before he had made the earth with its fields, or the first of the dust of the world. When he established the heavens, I was there; when he drew a circle on the face of the deep, when he made firm the skies above, when he established the fountains of the deep, when he assigned to the sea its limit, so that the waters might not transgress his command, when he marked out the foundations of the earth, then I was beside him, like a master workman, and I was daily his delight, rejoicing before him always, rejoicing in his inhabited world and delighting in the children of man. This is the Word of the Lord.

Remain <u>seated</u> for the Second Reading. (Romans. 5; 1-5).

Reader A reading from the letter of St Paul to the Romans.

Brothers and Sisters: Since we have been justified by faith, we have peace with God through our Lord Jesus Christ.

Through him we have also obtained access by faith into this grace in which we stand, and we rejoice in hope of the glory of God. Not only that, but we rejoice in our sufferings, knowing that suffering produces endurance, and endurance produces character, and character produces hope, and hope does not put us to shame, because God's love has been poured into our hearts through the Holy Spirit who has been given to us.

This is the Word of the Lord.

People Thanks be to God.

We pause for reflection. Then stand for the Gospel Acclamation,

Choir Alleluia! Alleluia! Alleluia! People Alleluia! Alleluia! Alleluia!

Choir Glory be to the Father, and to the Son, and to the Holy

Spirit; the God who is, who was, and who is to come.

People Alleluia! Alleluia! Alleluia!

Priest The Lord be with you People And also with you.

Priest A reading from the holy Gospel according to John.

(John 16; 12-15).

People Glory to you, O Lord.

Priest At that time: Jesus said to his disciples, 'I still have many things to say to you, but you cannot bear them now. When the Spirit of truth comes, he will guide you into all the truth, for he will not speak on his own authority, but whatever he hears he will speak, and he will declare to you the things that are to come. He will glorify me, for he will take what is mine and declare it to you. All that the Father

has is mine; therefore I said that he will take what is mine and declare it to you.'

This is the Gospel of the Lord.

People Praise to you, O Christ.

People Alleluia! Alleluia! Alleluia!

Please sit for the Homily from Fr Henry.

Then stand to recite the Nicene Creed,

People

I believe in one God, the Father almighty, maker of heaven and earth, of all things visible and invisible. I believe in one Lord Jesus Christ, the Only Begotten Son of God, born of the Father before all ages. God from God, Light from Light, true God from true God, begotten, not made, consubstantial with the Father; through him all things were made. For us men and for our salvation he came down from heaven, and by the Holy Spirit was incarnate of the Virgin Mary and became man. For our sake he was crucified under Pontius Pilate, he suffered death and was buried, and rose again on the third day in accordance with the Scriptures. He ascended into heaven and is seated at the right hand of the Father. He will come again in glory to judge the living and the dead and his kingdom will have no end. I believe in the Holy Spirit, the Lord, the giver of life, who proceeds from the Father and the Son, who with the Father and the Son is adored and glorified, who has spoken through the prophets. I believe in one, holy, catholic and apostolic Church. I confess one Baptism for the forgiveness of sins and I look forward to the resurrection of the dead and the life of the world to come. Amen.

Please remain <u>standing</u> for the Prayers of Intercession. The Priest introduces and concludes the prayers. Priest Gathered in Jesus' name we pray in the power of the

Spirit to our Father.

Reader Lord, in your mercy or Reader Lord, hear us

People hear our prayer or People Lord, graciously hear us

At the prayer for the departed,

Reader Rest eternal grant to them, O Lord,

People and let light perpetual shine upon them.

When the prayers of the saints are asked for,

Hail Mary, full of grace, the Lord is with thee. Blessed art thou among women, and blessed is the fruit of thy womb, Jesus: Holy Mary, Mother of God, pray for us sinners, now and at the hour of our death. Amen.

In conclusion to the prayers,

Priest God our Father, Jesus your Son said that he is wherever

two or three of us are gathered in his name; see your faithful people gathered before you in his name and hear us as we pray in the power of your Holy Spirit, for his

sake. Merciful Father,

People Accept these prayers for the sake of your Son, our

Saviour Jesus Christ. Amen.

Please <u>sit</u> as the choir sing the anthem, "Hymn to the Trinty" by Pyotr Ilyich Tchaikovsky (1840-93), as bread and wine are brought to the altar,

Please stand to sing hymn REH **445**, as the collection is taken. A card reader is available at the back of church for contactless donations, or use the QR code.

Bright the vision that delighted Once the sight of Judah's seer; Sweet the countless tongues united To entrance the prophet's ear.

Round the Lord in glory seated Cherubim and seraphim

Filled his temple, and repeated Each to each the alternate hymn:

'Lord, thy glory fills the heaven; Earth is with its fullness stored; Unto thee be glory given, Holy, Holy, Holy Lord.'

Heaven is still with glory ringing, Earth takes up the angels' cry, 'Holy, Holy, Holy,' singing, 'Lord of hosts, the Lord most high.'

Priest Let us give thanks to the Lord our God.

People It is right to give him thanks and praise.

The priest prays the Preface to the Eucharistic Prayer, and then all sing the Sanctus and Benedictus,

People Holy, holy, holy Lord, God of power and might,

heaven and earth are full of your glory. Hosanna, hosanna in the highest. Blessed is he who comes in the name of the Lord. Hosanna, hosanna,

hosanna in the highest.

Please kneel and join in the Memorial Acclamation,

Priest Great is the mystery of Faith.

People Save us, Saviour of the world, for by your Cross and

Resurrection you have set us free.

The Eucharistic Prayer concludes, and all sing,

People Amen, Amen, Amen

Please <u>stand</u> for the Lord's Prayer,

Priest At the Saviour's command, and formed by divine

teaching, we dare to say,

People Our Father, who art in heaven,

hallowed be thy name, thy kingdom come; thy will be done; on earth as it is in heaven.

Give us this day our daily bread.

And forgive us our trespasses

as we forgive those who trespass against us.

And lead us not into temptation;

but deliver us from evil.

Priest Deliver us, Lord, we pray, from every evil,

graciously grant peace in our day, that by the help of your mercy, we may be always free from sin

and safe from all distress, as we await the blessed hope

and the coming of our Saviour, Jesus Christ.

People For the kingdom, the power, and the glory are yours

now and for ever.

Priest Lord Jesus Christ, who said to your Apostles:

Peace I leave you, my peace I give you;

look not on our sins, but on the faith of your Church, and graciously grant her peace and unity in accordance with your will. Who live and reign for ever and ever.

People Amen.

Priest The peace of the Lord be always with you.

People And also with you.

Deacon Let us offer one another a sign of peace.

Now sing the Agnus Dei

Lamb of God, you take away the sins of the world, have mercy on us. (repeated)
Lamb of God, you take away the sins of the world, grant us peace.

Then kneel.

Priest Behold the Lamb of God. Behold him who takes away

the sins of the world. Blessed are those called to the

supper of the Lamb.

People Lord, I am not worthy that you should enter under

my roof, but only say the word and my soul shall be

healed.

Priest Since you are children of God, God has sent into your

hearts the Spirit of his Son, the Spirit who cries out: Abba,

Father.

The people come forward to receive communion. If you have **not** been <u>baptised</u> <u>and confirmed</u>, please come forward for a blessing instead of communion, carrying this Order of Service.

During communion hymn REH **402** is sung, for which all remain <u>seated or kneeling</u>,

Victim Divine, thy grace we claim
While thus thy precious death we show;
Once offered up, a spotless Lamb,
In thy great temple here below,
Thou didst for all mankind atone,
And standest now before the throne.

Thou standest in the holiest place,
As now for guilty sinners slain;
Thy blood of sprinkling speaks and prays
All-prevalent for helpless man;
Thy blood is still our ransom found,
And spreads salvation all around.

We need not now go up to heaven
To bring the long-sought Saviour down;
Thou art to all already given,
Thou dost e'en now thy banquet crown:
To every faithful soul appear,

blessed art thou among women, and blessed is the fruit of thy womb, Jesus. Holy Mary, Mother of God, pray for us sinners, now, and at the hour of our death. Amen.

Priest Behold the handmaid of the Lord,

People be it unto me according to thy word. Hail Mary...

Priest And the Word was made flesh,
People and dwelt among us. Hail Mary...
Priest Pray for us, O holy Mother of God,

People that we may be made worthy of the promises of Christ.

Priest Let us pray. We beseech you, O Lord, pour your grace into

our hearts, so that as we have known the incarnation of your Son Jesus Christ through the message of an angel, so, by his cross and passion, we may be brought to the glory of his resurrection. Through the same Jesus Christ
