This booklet contains all the material you will need for today's celebration of Mass. We hope that you will find this service easy to follow, but please do not be afraid to ask if you are unsure what to do at any point. The building is fitted with an induction loop and you will find the best results away from the pillars.

Families with small children are very welcome to make use of the carpeted play area at the back of church, where you will find books, crayons and soft toys. There are two further play stations in the side aisles.

A toilet is at the back of church, behind the screen. After Mass, please join us in the hall for refreshments. Before Mass, please try to maintain an atmosphere of quiet prayer.

Mass setting: Heritage Mass.

Please <u>stand</u> when the bell rings, for the procession of the clergy and servers, and to sing hymn REH 580:

We all sing the Gloria.

People Glory to God in the highest, and on earth peace to people of good will. We praise you, we bless you, we adore you, we glorify you, we give you thanks for your great glory. Lord God, heavenly King, O God, almighty Father. Lord Jesus Christ, Only Begotten Son, Lord God, Lamb of God, Son of the Father, you take away the sins of the world, have mercy on us; You take away the sins of the world, receive our prayer; you are seated at the right hand of the Father, have mercy on us. For you alone are the Holy One, you alone are the Lord, you alone are the Most High, Jesus Christ, with the Holy Spirit, in the glory of God the Father. Amen.

Then the priest prays the collect:

Priest Almighty ever-living God, increase our faith, hope and charity, and make us love what you command, so that we may merit what you promise. Through our Lord Jesus Christ, your Son, who lives and reigns with you in the unity of the Holy Spirit, God, for ever and ever.

People Amen.

Now <u>sit</u> to listen to the first reading:


Reader A reading from the book of Jeremiah. (Jeremiah 31; 7-9).
The Lord says this:

Remain seated to sing the Psalm (126)



Remain seated for the second reading:

ReaderA reading from the letter to the Hebrews. (Hebrews 5; 1-6)Every high priest has been taken out of mankind and is
appointed to act for men in their relations with God, to
offer gifts and sacrifices for sins; and so he can sympathise
with those who are ignorant or uncertain because he too
lives in the limitations of weakness. That is why he has to
make sin offerings for himself as well as for the people. No
one takes this honour on himself, but each one is called by
God, as Aaron was. Nor did Christ give himself the glory of
becoming high priest, but he had it from the one who said
to him: You are my son, today I have become your father,
and in another text: You are a priest of the order of
Melchizedek, and for ever.

<u>Stand</u> for the gospel acclamation after a brief pause for reflection.

Deacon The Lord be with you,

- Deacon A reading from the holy Gospel according to Mark. (Mark 10; 35-45).
- People Glory to you, O Lord.
- Deacon As Jesus left Jericho with his disciples and a large crowd, Bartimaeus (that is, the son of Timaeus), a blind beggar, was sitting at the side of the road. When he heard that it was Jesus of Nazareth, he began to shout and to say, 'Son of David, Jesus, have pity on me.' And many of them scolded him and told him to keep quiet, but he only

shouted all the louder, 'Son of David, have pity on me.' Jesus stopped and said, 'Call him here.' So they called the blind man. 'Courage,' they said 'get up; he is calling you.' So throwing off his cloak, he jumped up and went to Jesus. Then Jesus spoke, 'What do you want me to do for you?' 'Rabbuni,' the blind man said to him 'Master, let me see again.' Jesus said to him, 'Go; your faith has saved you.' And immediately his sight returned and he followed him along the road.

All <u>stand</u> to say the Nicene Creed:

People I believe in one God, the Father almighty, maker of heaven and earth, of all things visible and invisible.

> I believe in one Lord Jesus Christ, the Only Begotten Son of God, born of the Father before all ages. God from God, Light from Light, true God from true God, begotten, not made, consubstantial with the Father, through him all things were made. For us men and for our salvation he came down from heaven, and by the Holy Spirit was incarnate of the Virgin Mary, and became man. For our sake he was crucified under Pontius Pilate, he suffered death and was buried, and rose again on the third day in accordance with the Scriptures. He ascended into heaven, and is seated at the right hand of the Father. He will come again in glory to judge the living and the dead and his kingdom will have no end.

I believe in the Holy Spirit, the Lord, the giver of life, who proceeds from the Father and the Son, who with the Father and the Son is adored and glorified, who has spoken through the prophets. I believe in one holy, catholic and apostolic Church. I confess one Baptism for the forgiveness of sins and I look forward to the resurrection of the dead, and the life of the world to come. Amen.

Please remain standing for the Prayers of Intercession.

At the prayer for the departed,

Reader Rest eternal grant unto them, O Lord.

When the prayers of the saints are asked,

Please <u>sit</u>, as the Choir sing "A Clare Benediction", by Sir John Rutter (born 1945), and bread and wine are brought to the altar.

<u>Stand</u> to sing hymn REH 420, as the altar is prepared and the collection is taken. If you want to give by card, there is a card reader at the back of church. Thine arm, O Lord, in days of old Was strong to heal and save; It triumphed o'er disease and death, O'er darkness and the grave; To thee they went, the blind, the dumb, The palsied and the lame, The leper with his tainted life, The sick with fevered frame.

And lo! thy touch brought life and health, Gave speech, and strength, and sight; And youth renewed and frenzy calmed Owned thee the Lord of light; And now, O Lord, be near to bless, Almighty as of yore, In crowded street, by restless couch, As by Gennesareth's shore.

Be thou our great deliverer still, Thou Lord of life and death; Restore and quicken, soothe and bless With thine almighty breath; To hands that work, and eyes that see, Give wisdom's heavenly lore, That whole and sick, and weak and strong, May praise thee evermore.

The Priest says

The Priest prays the Preface to the Eucharistic Prayer, and then all sing the Sanctus and Benedictus:

People Holy, holy, holy Lord, God of hosts. Heaven and earth are full of your glory. Hosanna! Hosanna in the highest.
 Blessed is he who comes in the name of the Lord.
 Hosanna! Hosanna in the highest.

Please <u>kneel</u>. The Eucharistic Prayer continues, until the Words of Institution. Then all make the Memorial Acclamation:

Deacon Great is the mystery of faith.

People Save us, Saviour of the world, for by your cross and resurrection you have set us free.

The Priest concludes the Eucharistic Prayer, and all sing:

People Amen! Amen! Amen!

Please <u>stand</u> for the Lord's Prayer.

Priest At the Saviour's command, and formed by divine teaching, we dare to sing,

 People
 Our Father, who art in heaven hallowed be thy name, thy kingdom come, thy will be done; on earth as it is in heaven.

	Give us this day our daily bread.
	And forgive us our trespasses
	as we forgive those who trespass against us.
	And lead us not into temptation;
	but deliver us from evil.
Priest	Deliver us, Lord, we pray, from every evil, graciously grant
	peace in our day, that by the help of your mercy, we may

Deacon Let us offer one another a sign of peace.

Now sing the Agnus Dei

People Lamb of God, you take away the sins of the world: have mercy on us. (repeated)
 Lamb of God, you take away the sins of the world: grant us peace.

Then <u>kneel.</u>

- *Priest* Behold the Lamb of God. Behold him who takes away the sins of the world. Blessed are those called to the supper of the Lamb.
- PeopleLord, I am not worthy that you should enter under myroof, but only say the word and my soul shall be healed.
- *Priest* Christ loved us and gave himself up for us, as a fragrant offering to God.

The people come forward to receive Communion. If you have not been baptized and confirmed, please come forward for a blessing instead of Communion, carrying this order of service.

During Communion hymn REH 399 is sung, all remaining <u>seated or kneeling</u>. Strengthen for service, Lord, the hands That holy things have taken; Let ears that now have heard thy songs To clamour never waken.

Lord, may the tongues which 'Holy' sang Keep free from all deceiving; The eyes which saw thy love be bright, Thy blessèd hope perceiving.

The feet that tread thy holy courts From light do thou not banish; The bodies by thy Body fed With thy new life replenish. Syrian 4th century. Tr CW Humphreys (1840-1921) & Percy Dearmer (1867-1936). All stand for the Post-Communion Prayer:
