This booklet contains all the material you will need for today's celebration of Mass. We hope that you will find this service easy to follow, but please do not be afraid to ask if you are unsure what to do at any point. The building is fitted with an induction loop and you will find the best results away from the pillars.

Families with small children are very welcome to make use of the carpeted play area at the back of church, where you will find books, crayons and soft toys.

There is a further play station in the north (left-hand side) aisle.

A toilet is at the back of church, behind the screen. After Mass, please join us in the hall for refreshments. Before Mass, please try to maintain an atmosphere of quiet prayer.

Mass setting: Heritage Mass.

Please <u>stand</u> when the bell rings, for the procession of the clergy and servers, and to sing hymn REH 430:

All people that on earth do dwell,
Sing to the Lord with cheerful voice;
Him serve with fear, his praise forth tell,
Come ye before him, and rejoice.

The Lord, ye know, is God indeed, Without our aid he did us make; We are his folk, he doth us feed, And for his sheep he doth us take.

O enter then his gates with praise, Approach with joy his courts unto; Praise, laud, and bless his name always, For it is seemly so to do.

and sisters, to pray for me to the Lord our God.

Remain standing to sing the Kyries:

We all sing the Gloria.

People

Glory to God in the highest, and on earth peace to people of good will. We praise you, we bless you, we adore you, we glorify you, we give you thanks for your great glory. Lord God, heavenly King, O God, almighty Father. Lord Jesus Christ, Only Begotten Son, Lord God, Lamb of God, Son of the Father, you take away the sins of the world, have mercy on us; You take away the sins of the world, receive our prayer; you are seated at the right hand of the Father, have mercy on us. For you alone are the Holy One, you alone are the Lord, you alone are the Most High, Jesus Christ, with the Holy Spirit, in the glory of God the Father. Amen.

Then the priest prays the collect:

Priest

Almighty ever-living God, increase our faith, hope and charity, and make us love what you command, so that we may merit what you promise. Through our Lord Jesus Christ, your Son, who lives and reigns with you in the unity of the Holy Spirit, God, for ever and ever.

People Amen.

Now <u>sit</u> to listen to the first reading:

Reader

A reading from the book of Sirach. (Ecclesiasticus 35; 12-14, 16-19).

The Lord is the judge, and with him is no partiality. He will not show partiality in the case of a poor man; and he will listen to the prayer of one who is wronged. He will not ignore the supplication of the orphan or the widow when she pours out her story. He whose service is pleasing to the Lord will be accepted, and his prayer will reach to the clouds. The prayer of the humble pierces the clouds, and he will not be consoled until it reaches the Lord; he will not desist until the Most High visits him and does justice

for the righteous and executes judgement. And the Lord will not delay.

This is the word of the Lord.

Remain seated to sing the Psalm (34)

Remain seated for the second reading:

Reader A reading from the second letter of St Paul to Timothy. (2 Timothy 4; 6-8, 16-18)

Beloved: I am already being poured out as a drink offering, and the time of my departure has come. I have fought the good fight, I have finished the race, I have kept the faith. Henceforth there is laid up for me the crown of righteousness, which the Lord, the righteous judge, will award to me on that day, and not only to me, but also to all who have loved his appearing.

At my first defence no one came to stand by me, but all deserted me. May it not be charged against them! But the Lord stood by me and strengthened me, so that through me the message might be fully proclaimed and all the Gentiles might hear it. So I was rescued from the lion's mouth. The Lord will rescue me from every evil deed and bring me safely into his heavenly kingdom. To him be the glory for ever and ever. Amen.

<u>Stand</u> for the gospel acclamation after a brief pause for reflection.

Choir Alleluia! Alleluia! Alleluia! People Alleluia! Alleluia! Alleluia!

Choir God was in Christ reconciling the world to himself, and entrusting to us the message of reconciliation.

Priest The Lord be with you, People And also with you.

Priest A reading from the holy Gospel according to Luke. (Luke 18;

9-14).

People Glory to you, O Lord.

Priest

At that time: Jesus told this parable to some who trusted in themselves that they were righteous, and treated others with contempt: 'Two men went up into the Temple to pray, one a Pharisee and the other a tax collector. The Pharisee, standing by himself, prayed thus: "God, I thank you that I am not like other men, extortioners, unjust, adulterers, or even like this tax collector. I fast twice a week; I give tithes of all that I get." But the tax collector, standing far off, would not even lift up his eyes to heaven, but beat his breast, saying, "God, be merciful to me, a sinner!" I tell you, this man went down to his house justified, rather than the

other. For everyone who exalts himself will be humbled, but the one who humbles himself will be exalted.'

All <u>stand</u> to say the Nicene Creed:

People

I believe in one God, the Father almighty, maker of heaven and earth, of all things visible and invisible.

I believe in one Lord Jesus Christ, the Only Begotten Son of God, born of the Father before all ages. God from God, Light from Light, true God from true God, begotten, not made, consubstantial with the Father, through him all things were made. For us men and for our salvation he came down from heaven, and by the Holy Spirit was incarnate of the Virgin Mary, and became man. For our sake he was crucified under Pontius Pilate, he suffered death and was buried, and rose again on the third day in accordance with the Scriptures. He ascended into heaven, and is seated at the right hand of the Father. He will come again in glory to judge the living and the dead and his kingdom will have no end.

I believe in the Holy Spirit, the Lord, the giver of life, who proceeds from the Father and the Son, who with the Father and the Son is adored and glorified, who has spoken through the prophets. I believe in one holy, catholic and apostolic Church. I confess one Baptism for the forgiveness of sins and I look forward to the resurrection of the dead, and the life of the world to come. Amen.

Please remain standing for the Prayers of Intercession.

Priest On this day that the Lord has made, let us pray to the

Father who raised Jesus from the dead.

Reader Lord, in your mercy, / Lord, hear us.

People Hear our prayer. / Lord, graciously hear us.

At the prayer for the departed,

Reader Rest eternal grant unto them, O Lord.

People and let light perpetual shine upon them.

When the prayers of the saints are asked,

Hail, Mary, full of grace, the Lord is with thee. Blessed art thou among women, and blessed is the fruit of thy womb, Jesus: Holy Mary, Mother of God, pray for us sinners, now and at the hour of our death. Amen.

In conclusion to the prayers:

Priest Father, you have promised to hear the prayers of those

who ask in the name of your Son: grant that what we

have asked faithfully we may obtain effectually, according

to your will. Merciful Father,

People Accept these prayers for the sake of your Son, our

Saviour Jesus Christ. Amen.

Please <u>sit</u>, as the Choir sing an anthem, and bread and wine are brought to the altar.

<u>Stand</u> to sing hymn REH 487, as the altar is prepared and the collection is taken. If you want to give by card, there is a card reader at the back of church.

The Priest sings the opening of the Eucharistic Prayer:

Priest The Lord be with you.

People And also with you.

Priest Lift up your hearts.

People We lift them up to the Lord.

Priest Let us give thanks to the Lord our God.

People It is right to give him thanks and praise.

The Priest prays the Preface to the Eucharistic Prayer, and then all sing the Sanctus and Benedictus:

People Holy, holy, holy Lord, God of hosts. Heaven and earth are full of your glory. Hosanna! Hosanna in the highest.

Blessed is he who comes in the name of the Lord. Hosanna! Hosanna in the highest.

Please <u>kneel</u>. The Eucharistic Prayer continues, until the Words of Institution. Then all make the Memorial Acclamation:

Priest Great is the mystery of faith.

People Save us, Saviour of the world, for by your cross and resurrection you have set us free.

The Priest concludes the Eucharistic Prayer, and all sing:

People Amen! Amen! Amen!

Please stand for the Lord's Prayer.

Priest At the Saviour's command, and formed by divine

teaching, we dare to sing,

People Our Father, who art in heaven

hallowed be thy name,

thy kingdom come, thy will be done;

on earth as it is in heaven.

Give us this day our daily bread.

And forgive us our trespasses

as we forgive those who trespass against us.

And lead us not into temptation;

but deliver us from evil.

Priest Deliver us, Lord, we pray, from every evil, graciously grant

peace in our day, that by the help of your mercy, we may be always free from sin and safe from all distress, as we await the blessed hope and the coming of our Saviour

Jesus Christ.

People For the kingdom, the power, and the glory are yours,

now and for ever.

Priest Lord Jesus Christ, who said to your apostles: Peace I leave

you, my peace I give you; look not on our sins, but on the

faith of your Church, and graciously grant her peace and

unity in accordance with your will. Who live and reign for ever and ever.

People Amen.

Priest The peace of the Lord be always with you.

People And also with you.

Priest Let us offer one another a sign of peace.

Now sing the Agnus Dei

People Lamb of God, you take away the sins of the world: have

mercy on us. (repeated)

Lamb of God, you take away the sins of the world: grant

us peace.

Then <u>kneel.</u>

Priest Behold the Lamb of God. Behold him who takes away the

sins of the world. Blessed are those called to the supper

of the Lamb.

People Lord, I am not worthy that you should enter under my

roof, but only say the word and my soul shall be healed.

Priest We will ring out our joy at your saving help

and exult in the name of our God.

The people come forward to receive Communion. If you have not been baptized and confirmed, please come forward for a blessing instead of Communion, carrying this order of service.

During Communion hymn REH 398 is sung, all remaining seated or kneeling.

Once, only once, and once for all, His precious life he gave; Before the Cross in faith we fall, And own it strong to save. 'One offering, single and complete,'
With lips and hearts we say;
But what he never can repeat
He shows forth day by day.

For as the priest of Aaron's line
Within the holiest stood,
And sprinkled all the mercy-shrine
With sacrificial blood;

So he, who once atonement wrought, Our Priest of endless power, Presents himself for those he bought In that dark noontide hour.

His Manhood pleads where now it lives On heaven's eternal throne, And where in mystic rite he gives Its presence to his own.

Please <u>sit</u> for the notices.

Then <u>stand</u> for the blessing and dismissal

Priest The Lord be with you.

People And also with you.

Priest May almighty God bless you, the Father, and the Son, and

the Holy Spirit.

People Amen.

Priest Go forth, the Mass is ended.

People Thanks be to God.

The clergy and servers go to the shrine of Our Lady for the Angelus.

Priest The angel of the Lord brought tidings to Mary,

People And she conceived by the Holy Spirit.

Hail Mary, full of grace, the Lord is with thee; blessed art

thou among women, and blessed is the fruit of thy womb, Jesus. Holy Mary, Mother of God, pray for us sinners, now and at the hour of our death. Amen.

Priest Behold the handmaid of the Lord,

People Be it unto me according to thy word. Hail Mary...

Priest And the word was made flesh,

People And dwelt among us. Hail Mary...

Priest Pray for us, O holy Mother of God.

People That we may be made worthy of the promises of Christ.

Priest Let us pray. We beseech you, O Lord, pour your grace into

our hearts, so that as we have known the incarnation of your Son Jesus Christ through the message of an angel, so, by his cross and passion, we may be brought to the glory of his resurrection. Through the same Jesus Christ

our Lord.

People Amen.

Remain standing to sing hymn REH 486 as clergy and servers depart:

I heard the voice of Jesus say,
'Come unto me and rest;
Lay down, thou weary one, lay down
Thy head upon my breast:'
I came to Jesus as I was,
Weary, and worn, and sad;
I found in him a resting place,
And he has made me glad.

I heard the voice of Jesus say,
