This booklet contains all the material you will need for today's celebration of Mass. We hope that you will find this service easy to follow, but please do not be afraid to ask if you are unsure what to do at any point. The building is fitted with an induction loop and you will find the best results away from the pillars.

Families with small children are very welcome to make use of the carpeted play area at the back of church, where you will find books, crayons and soft toys. There are two further play stations in the side aisles. Older children should join Children's Church, who will go out to the Hall after the first hymn, and return in time for Communion.

A toilet is at the back of church, behind the screen. After Mass, please join us in the hall for refreshments. Before Mass, please try to maintain an atmosphere of quiet prayer.

Please <u>stand</u> when the bell rings, for the procession of the clergy and servers, and to sing hymn 342:

The Church's one foundation Is Jesus Christ, her Lord; She is his new creation By water and the word: From heaven he came and sought her To be his holy Bride, With his own blood he bought her, And for her life he died.

Elect from every nation, Yet one o'er all the earth, Her charter of salvation One Lord, one faith, one birth; One holy name she blesses, Partakes one holy food, And to one hope she presses With every grace endued. Though with a scornful wonder Men see her sore oppressed, By schisms rent asunder, By heresies distressed, Yet saints their watch are keeping, Their cry goes up, 'How long?' We all sing the Gloria.

People Glory to God, glory to God in the highest, and peace, peace to his people on earth. Lord God, heavenly King, almighty God and Father, we worship you, we give you thanks, we praise you for your glory. Lord Jesus Christ, only Son of the Father, Lord God, Lamb of God, you take away the sin of the world: have mercy on us; you are seated at the right hand of the Father: receive our prayer. For you alone are the Holy One, you alone are the Lord, you alone are the most high, Jesus Christ, with the Holy Spirit, in the glory of God the Father. Amen. Amen.

Then the priest prays the collect:

Priest Grant us, we pray, O Lord our God, the constant gladness of being devoted to you, for it is full and lasting happiness to serve with constancy the author of all that is good.
Through our Lord Jesus Christ, your Son, who lives and reigns with you in the unity of the Holy Spirit, God, for ever and ever.

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People Amen.
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Now <u>sit</u> to listen to the first reading:

Reader A reading from the book of Daniel. (Daniel 12; 1-3) 'At that time Michael will stand up, the great prince who mounts guard over your people. There is going to be a time of great distress, unparalleled since nations first came into existence. When that time comes, your own people will be spared, all those whose names are found written in the Book. Of those who lie sleeping in the dust of the earth many will awake, some to everlasting life, some to shame and everlasting disgrace. The learned will shine as brightly as the vault of heaven, and those who have instructed many in virtue, as bright as stars for all eternity.'

This is the word of the Lord.

Reader A reading from the letter to the Hebrews. (Hebrews 10; 11-14, 18)

All the priests stand at their duties every day, offering over and over again the same sacrifices which are quite incapable of taking sins away. He, on the other hand, has offered one single sacrifice for sins, and then taken his place forever, at the right hand of God, where he is now waiting until his enemies are made into a footstool for him. By virtue of that one single offering, he has achieved the eternal perfection of all whom he is sanctifying. When all sins have been forgiven, there can be no more sin offerings.

<u>Stand</u> for the gospel acclamation after a brief pause for reflection.

- *Choir* Stay awake, praying at all times for the strength to stand with confidence before the Son of Man.

Deacon A reading from the holy Gospel according to Mark. (Mark 13; 24-32)

People Glory to you, O Lord.

Deacon Jesus said to his disciples: 'In those days, after the time of distress, the sun will be darkened, the moon will lose its brightness, the stars will come falling from heaven and the powers in the heavens will be shaken. And then they will see the Son of Man coming in the clouds with great power and glory; then too he will send the angels to gather his chosen from the four winds, from the ends of the world to the ends of heaven.

'Take the fig tree as a parable: as soon as its twigs grow supple and its leaves come out, you know that summer is near. So with you when you see these things happening: know that he is near, at the very gates. I tell you solemnly, before this generation has passed away all these things will have taken place. Heaven and earth will pass away, but my words will not pass away.

'But as for that day or hour, nobody knows it, neither the angels of heaven, nor the Son; no one but the Father.' This is the Gospel of the Lord.

Please <u>sit</u> for the Homily from Fr Paul.

All <u>stand</u> to say the Nicene Creed:

 People I believe in one God, the Father almighty, maker of heaven and earth, of all things visible and invisible.
 I believe in one Lord Jesus Christ, the Only Begotten Son of God, born of the Father before all ages. God from God, Light from Light, true God from true God, begotten, not made, consubstantial with the Father, through him all things were made. For us men and for our salvation he came down from heaven, and by the Holy Spirit was incarnate of the Virgin Mary, and became man. For our sake he was crucified under Pontius Pilate, he suffered death and was buried, and rose again on the third day in accordance with the Scriptures. He ascended into heaven, and is seated at the right hand of the Father. He will come again in glory to judge the living and the dead and his kingdom will have no end.

I believe in the Holy Spirit, the Lord, the giver of life, who proceeds from the Father and the Son, who with the Father and the Son is adored and glorified, who has spoken through the prophets. I believe in one holy, catholic and apostolic Church. I confess one Baptism for the forgiveness of sins and I look forward to the resurrection of the dead, and the life of the world to come. Amen.

Please remain standing for the Prayers of Intercession.

Priest In the power of the Spirit and in union with Christ, let us pray to God our Father.

Reader Lord, in your mercy, / Lord, hear us.

People Hear our prayer. / Lord, graciously hear us.

At the prayer for the departed,

Reader Rest eternal grant unto them, O Lord.

People and let light perpetual shine upon them.

When the prayers of the saints are asked,

Hail, Mary, full of grace, the Lord is with thee. Blessed art thou among women, and blessed is the fruit of thy womb, Jesus: Holy Mary, Mother of God, pray for us sinners, now and at the hour of our death. Amen.

In conclusion to the prayers:

Priest Father, you have promised to hear the prayers of those who ask in the name of your Son: grant that what we

have asked in faith may be granted to us according to your will. Merciful Father,

People Accept these prayers for the sake of your Son, our Saviour Jesus Christ. Amen.

Please <u>sit</u>, as the Choir sing "Call to Remembrance", by Richard Farrant (d.1580), and bread and wine are brought to the altar.

<u>Stand</u> to sing hymn 439, as the altar is prepared and the collection is taken. If you want to give by card, there is a card reader at the back of church.

The Priest sings the opening of the Eucharistic Prayer:

Priest Lift up your hearts.

People **We lift them up to the Lord.**

Priest Let us give thanks to the Lord our God.

People It is right to give him thanks and praise.

The Priest prays the Preface to the Eucharistic Prayer, and then all sing the Sanctus and Benedictus:

People Holy, holy, holy Lord, God of power and might. Heaven and earth are full of your glory. Hosanna, hosanna, hosanna in the highest. Blessed is he who comes in the name of the Lord. Hosanna, hosanna, hosanna in the highest.

Please <u>kneel</u>. The Eucharistic Prayer continues, until the Words of Institution. Then all make the Memorial Acclamation:

Deacon Great is the mystery of faith.

People Save us, Saviour of the world, for by your cross and resurrection you have set us free.

The Priest concludes the Eucharistic Prayer, and all sing:

People Amen! Amen! Amen!

Please <u>stand</u> for the Lord's Prayer.

Priest At the Saviour's command, and formed by divine teaching, we dare to pray,

People	Our Father, who art in heaven hallowed be thy name, thy kingdom come, thy will be done; on earth as it is in heaven. Give us this day our daily bread. And forgive us our trespasses as we forgive those who trespass against us. And lead us not into temptation; but deliver us from evil.
Priest	Deliver us, Lord, we pray, from every evil, graciously grant peace in our day, that by the help of your mercy, we may be always free from sin and safe from all distress, as we await the blessed hope and the coming of our Saviour Jesus Christ.
People	For the kingdom, the power, and the glory are yours, now and for ever.
Priest	Lord Jesus Christ, who said to your apostles: Peace I leave you, my peace I give you; look not on our sins, but on the faith of your Church, and graciously grant her peace and unity in accordance with your will. Who live and reign for ever and ever.
People	Amen.
Priest	The peace of the Lord be always with you.

- *People* And also with you.
- *Deacon* Let us offer one another a sign of peace.

Now sing the Agnus Dei

People Lamb of God, you take away the sins of the world: have mercy on us. (repeated)
 Lamb of God, you take away the sins of the world: grant us peace.

Then <u>kneel.</u>

- *Priest* Behold the Lamb of God. Behold him who takes away the sins of the world. Blessed are those called to the supper of the Lamb.
- People Lord, I am not worthy that you should enter under my roof, but only say the word and my soul shall be healed.
- *Priest* To be near God is my happiness, to place my hope in God the Lord.

The people come forward to receive Communion. If you have not been baptized and confirmed, please come forward for a blessing instead of Communion, carrying this order of service.

During Communion hymn 367 is sung, all remaining <u>seated or kneeling</u>. All for Jesus! All for Jesus! This our song shall ever be; For we have not hope nor Saviour If we have not hope in thee.

All for Jesus! Thou wilt give us Strength to serve thee hour by hour: None can move us from thy presence While we trust thy love and power.

All for Jesus! At thine altar Plead we still that dreadful price; Thee we offer, thee we worship, In the holy sacrifice.

All for Jesus! At thine altar Thou dost give us sweet content; There, dear Saviour, we receive thee In thy holy sacrament. All for Jesus! Thou hast loved us, All for Jesus! Thou hast died, All for Jesus! Thou art with us, All for Jesus, glorified!

All for Jesus! All for Jesus! This the Church's song must be, Till at last when all are gathered One in love, and one in thee.
