25TH DECEMBER 2024, 10.30AM

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Welcome to St George's! This booklet contains all the material you will need for today's celebration of Mass. We hope you will find this service easy to follow, but please also do not be afraid to ask if you are unsure what to do at any point. The building is fitted with an Induction Loop - sit away from the pillars for best results! Families with small children are very welcome to make use of the carpeted area at the back of church, where you will find books, crayons and soft toys. A toilet is at the back of church behind the screen. Before Mass, please try to maintain an atmosphere of quiet prayer.

Mass setting: Lourdes.

Please <u>stand</u> when the bell rings, for the procession of the clergy and servers, and to sing hymn REH 35:

God rest you merry, gentlemen,
Let nothing you dismay,
For Jesus Christ our Saviour

O tidings of comfort and joy, comfort and joy!

Remain standing to sing the Gloria

Now <u>sit</u> to listen to the First Reading. Isaiah 52; 7-10.

Reader A reading from the book of the prophet Isaiah.

How beautiful upon the mountains are the feet of him who brings good news, who publishes peace, who brings

good news of happiness, who publishes salvation, who says to Sion, 'Your God reigns.' The voice of your watchmen — they lift up their voice; together they sing for joy; for eye to eye they see the return of the Lord to Sion. Break forth together into singing, you waste places of Jerusalem, for the Lord has comforted his people; he has redeemed Jerusalem. The Lord has bared his holy arm before the eyes of all the nations, and all the ends of the earth shall see the salvation of our God.

This is the Word of the Lord.

Remain <u>seated</u> to sing the Psalm (98).

Remain seated for the Second Reading. Hebrews 1; 1-6.

Reader A reading from the letter to the Hebrews.

Long ago, at many times and in many ways, God spoke to our fathers by the prophets, but in these last days he has spoken to us by his Son, whom he appointed the heir of all things, through whom also he created the world. He is the radiance of the glory of God and the exact imprint of his nature, and he upholds the universe by the word of his power. After making purification for sins, he sat down at the right hand of the Majesty on high, having become as much superior to angels as the name he has inherited is more excellent than theirs. For to which of the angels did God ever say, 'You are my Son, today I have begotten you'? Or again, 'I will be to him a father, and he shall be to me a son'? And again, when he brings the firstborn into the world, he says, 'Let all God's angels worship him.' This is the Word of the Lord.

People Thanks be to God.

We pause for reflection. Then stand for the Gospel Acclamation,

Priest A reading from the holy Gospel according to John.

John 1; 1-18.

People Glory to you, O Lord.

Priest In the beginning was the Word, and the Word was with God, and

the Word was God. He was in the beginning with God. All things were made through him, and without him was not any thing made that was made. In him was life, and the life was the light of men.

The light shines in the darkness, and the darkness has not overcome it.

There was a man sent from God, whose name was John. He came as a witness, to bear witness about the light, that all might believe through him. He was not the light, but came to bear witness about the light.

The true light, which gives light to everyone, was coming into the world. He was in the world, and the world was made through him, yet the world did not know him. He came to his own, and his own people did not receive him. But to all who did receive him, who believed in his name, he gave the right to become children of God, who were born, not of blood nor of the will of the flesh nor of the will of man, but of God. And the Word became flesh and dwelt among us, and we have seen his glory, glory as of the Only Begotten from the Father, full of grace and truth. John bore witness about him, and cried out, 'This was he of whom I said, "He who comes after me ranks before me, because he was before me." '

For from his fullness we have all received, grace upon grace. For the law was given through Moses; grace and truth came through Jesus Christ. No one has ever seen God; the only begotten God, who is at the Father's side, he has made him known.

This is the Gospel of the Lord.

Please sit for the Homily from Fr Henry.

Then <u>stand</u> to recite the Nicene Creed:

People

I believe in one God, the Father almighty, maker of heaven and earth, of all things visible and invisible. I believe in one Lord Jesus Christ, the Only Begotten Son of God, born of the Father before all ages. God from God, Light from Light, true God from true God, begotten, not made, consubstantial with the Father; through him all things were made. For us men and for our salvation he came down from heaven, and by the Holy Spirit was incarnate of the Virgin Mary and became

man. For our sake he was crucified under Pontius Pilate, he suffered death and was buried, and rose again on the third day in accordance with the Scriptures. He ascended into heaven and is seated at the right hand of the Father. He will come again in glory to judge the living and the dead and his kingdom will have no end. I believe in the Holy Spirit, the Lord, the giver of life, who proceeds from the Father and the Son, who with the Father and the Son is adored and glorified, who has spoken through the prophets. I believe in one, holy, catholic and apostolic Church. I confess one Baptism for the forgiveness of sins and I look forward to the resurrection of the dead and the life of the world to come. Amen.

Please remain <u>standing</u> for the Prayers of Intercession.

Priest God sent his Son to live as a man among us. Let us pray in

the confidence of our new life in him.

After each bidding:

When the prayers of the saints are asked for:

Please <u>sit</u> for the anthem, "Ding Dong, Merrily on High" arranged by Charles Wood (1866-1926), as bread and wine are brought to the altar.

Please <u>stand</u> to sing hymn 37, as the collection is taken. If you want to give by card, there is a card reader at the back of church.

Priest Lift up your hearts.

People We lift them up to the Lord.

Priest Let us give thanks to the Lord our God.

People It is right to give him thanks and praise.

The priest prays the Preface to the Eucharistic Prayer, and then all sing the Sanctus and Benedictus:

Priest Great is the mystery of Faith.

Cantor You are the world's redeemer: save your people Lord.

Cantor By dying on the cross, you have set us free: save your

people Lord.

People Save your people Lord.

Cantor By rising from the dead, you have set us free: save your

people Lord.

People Save your people Lord.

The Eucharistic Prayer concludes, and all sing,

Priest Through him, with him, in him.

People Amen.

Priest in the unity of the Holy Spirit.

People Amen.

Priest all glory and honour is yours, almighty Father, for ever

and ever.

People Amen.

Please stand for the Lord's Prayer,

Priest At the Saviour's command, and formed by divine

teaching, we dare to say,

People Our Father, who art in heaven,

hallowed be thy name, thy kingdom come; thy will be done; on earth as it is in heaven.

Give us this day our daily bread.

And forgive us our trespasses

as we forgive those who trespass against us.

And lead us not into temptation;

but deliver us from evil.

Priest Deliver us, Lord, we pray, from every evil,

graciously grant peace in our day, that by the help of your mercy, we may be always free from sin

and safe from all distress, as we await the blessed hope

and the coming of our Saviour, Jesus Christ.

People Lord, I am not worthy that you should enter under

my roof, but only say the word and my soul shall be

healed.

Priest All the ends of the earth have seen the salvation of our

God.

The people come forward to receive communion. If you have **not** been <u>baptised</u> <u>and confirmed</u>, please come forward for a blessing instead of communion, carrying this Order of Service.

During communion hymn 39 is sung, for which all remain seated or kneeling,

In the bleak midwinter

Frosty wind made moan,

Earth stood hard as iron,

Water like a stone:

Snow had fallen, snow on snow,

Snow on snow,

In the bleak midwinter,

Then stand for the Blessing & Dismissal,

Priest Bow your heads and pray for God's blessing.

Priest May the God of infinite goodness, who by the Incarnation

of his Son has driven darkness from the world and by that glorious Birth has illumined this most holy day, drive far from you the darkness of vice and illumine your hearts

with the light of virtue.

People Amen.

Priest May God, who willed that the great joy of his Son's saving

Birth be announced to shepherds by the Angel, fill your minds with the gladness he gives and make you heralds of

his Gospel.

People Amen.

Priest And may God, who by the Incarnation brought together

the earthly and heavenly realm, fill you with the gift of his peace and favour and make you sharers with the Church

The priest leads the Angelus.
