Please <u>stand</u> when the bell rings, for the procession of the clergy and servers, and to sing hymn REH 165:

The priest introduces the Mass, and invites the people to recall and confess their sins:

justification: let us turn to him in penitence for our sins, that, by the light of his rising again, we may be brought to

newness of life in him.

sisters, that I have greatly sinned, in my thoughts and in my words, in what I have done and in what I have failed to do, through my fault, through my fault, through my most grievous fault; therefore I ask blessed Mary ever-virgin, all the angels and saints, and you, my brothers

and sisters, to pray for me to the Lord our God.

*Priest* May almighty God have mercy on us, forgive us our sins,

and bring us to everlasting life,

People Amen.

Remain standing to sing the Kyries:

*People* Lord, have mercy. Lord, have mercy.

Christ, have mercy. Christ, have mercy.

Lord, have mercy. Lord, have mercy.

We all sing the Gloria.

People

Glory to God in the highest, and peace to his people on earth. Lord God, heavenly King, almighty God and Father, we worship you, we give you thanks, we praise you for your glory. Lord Jesus Christ, only Son of the Father, Lord God, Lamb of God, you take away the sin of the world: have mercy on us; you are seated at the right hand of the Father: receive our prayer. For you alone are the Holy One, you alone are the Lord, you alone are the most high, Jesus Christ, with the Holy Spirit, in the glory of God the Father. Amen.

Then the priest prays the collect:

Priest

May your people exult for ever, O God, in renewed youthfulness of spirit, so that, rejoicing now in the restored glory of our adoption, we may look forward in confident hope to the rejoicing of the day of resurrection. Through our Lord Jesus Christ, your Son, who lives and reigns with you in the unity of the Holy Spirit, God, for ever and ever.

People Amen.

Now <u>sit</u> to listen to the first reading:

Reader

A reading from the Acts of the Apostles. (Acts 5; 27-32, 40-41). In those days: The high priest questioned the Apostles, saying, 'We strictly charged you not to teach in this name, yet here you have filled Jerusalem with your teaching, and you intend to bring this man's blood upon us.' But Peter and the Apostles answered, 'We must obey God rather than men. The God of our fathers raised Jesus, whom you

killed by hanging him on a tree. God exalted him at his right hand as Leader and Saviour, to give repentance to Israel and forgiveness of sins. And we are witnesses to these things, and so is the Holy Spirit, whom God has given to those who obey him.'

Having called in the Apostles, the council beat them and charged them not to speak in the name of Jesus, and let them go. Then they left the presence of the council, rejoicing that they were counted worthy to suffer dishonour for the name.



Reader

A reading from the book of Revelation. (Revelation 5; 11-14)
I, John looked, and I heard around the throne and the living creatures and the elders the voice of many angels, numbering myriads of myriads and thousands of thousands, saying with a loud voice, 'Worthy is the Lamb who was slain, to receive power and wealth and wisdom and might and honour and glory and blessing!' And I heard every creature in heaven and on earth and under the earth and in the sea, and all that is in them, saying, 'To him who sits on the throne and to the Lamb be blessing and honour and glory and might for ever and ever!' And the four living creatures said, 'Amen!' and the elders fell down and worshipped.

This is the word of the Lord.

People Thanks be to God.

Stand for the gospel acclamation after a brief pause for reflection.

Choir Alleluia! Alleluia! Alleluia! People Alleluia! Alleluia! Alleluia!

Choir Lord Jesus, explain the Scriptures to us.

Priest A reading from the holy Gospel according to Luke. (Luke 24;

35-48)

People Glory to you, O Lord.

Priest At that time: Jesus revealed himself again to the disciples

by the Sea of Tiberias, and he revealed himself in this way. Simon Peter, Thomas (called the Twin), Nathanael of Cana in Galilee, the sons of Zebedee, and two others of his disciples were together. Simon Peter said to them, 'I am going fishing.' They said to him, 'We will go with you.' They went out and got into the boat, but that night they caught nothing.

Just as day was breaking, Jesus stood on the shore; yet the disciples did not know that it was Jesus. Jesus said to them, 'Children, do you have any fish?' They answered him, 'No.' He said to them, 'Cast the net on the right side of the boat, and you will find some.' So they cast it, and now they were not able to haul it in, because of the quantity of fish. That disciple whom Jesus loved therefore said to Peter, 'It is the Lord!' When Simon Peter heard that it was the Lord, he put on his outer garment, for he was stripped for work, and threw himself into the sea. The other disciples came in the boat, dragging the net full of fish, for they were not far from the land, but about a hundred metres off.

When they got out on land, they saw a charcoal fire in place, with fish laid out on it, and bread. Jesus said to them, 'Bring some of the fish that you have just caught.' So Simon

Peter went aboard and hauled the net ashore, full of large fish, one hundred and fifty-three of them. And although there were so many, the net was not torn. Jesus said to them, 'Come and have breakfast.' Now none of the disciples dared ask him, 'Who are you?' They knew it was the Lord. Jesus came and took the bread and gave it to them, and so with the fish. This was now the third time that Jesus was revealed to the disciples after he was raised from the dead.

When they had finished breakfast, Jesus said to Simon Peter, 'Simon, son of John, do you love me more than these?' He said to him, 'Yes, Lord; you know that I love you.' He said to him, 'Feed my lambs.' He said to him a second time, 'Simon, son of John, do you love me?' He said to him, 'Yes, Lord; you know that I love you.' He said to him, 'Tend my sheep.' He said to him the third time, 'Simon, son of John, do you love me?' Peter was grieved because he said to him the third time, 'Do you love me?' and he said to him, 'Lord, you know everything; you know that I love you.' Jesus said to him, 'Feed my sheep. Truly, truly, I say to you, when you were young, you used to dress yourself and walk wherever you wanted, but when you are old, you will stretch out your hands, and another will dress you and carry you where you do not want to go.' (This he said to show by what kind of death he was to glorify God.) And after saying this he said to him, 'Follow me.'

This is the Gospel of the Lord.

People Praise to you, O Christ.

Please <u>sit</u> for the Homily from Fr David.

All <u>stand</u> to say the Nicene Creed:

People I believe in one God, the Father almighty, maker of heaven and earth, of all things visible and invisible.

I believe in one Lord Jesus Christ, the Only Begotten Son of God, born of the Father before all ages. God from God, Light from Light, true God from true God, begotten, not made, consubstantial with the Father, through him all things were made. For us men and for our salvation he came down from heaven, and by the Holy Spirit was incarnate of the Virgin Mary, and became man. For our sake he was crucified under Pontius Pilate, he suffered death and was buried, and rose again on the third day in accordance with the Scriptures. He ascended into heaven, and is seated at the right hand of the Father. He will come again in glory to judge the living and the dead and his kingdom will have no end.

I believe in the Holy Spirit, the Lord, the giver of life, who proceeds from the Father and the Son, who with the Father and the Son is adored and glorified, who has spoken through the prophets. I believe in one holy, catholic and apostolic Church. I confess one Baptism for the forgiveness of sins and I look forward to the resurrection of the dead, and the life of the world to come. Amen.

Please remain standing for the Prayers of Intercession.

When the prayers of the saints are asked,

In conclusion to the prayers:

Blessed George our patron, and all the redeemed, we may glorify and praise your Name in all that we are and do and

say this day. Merciful Father,

People Accept these prayers for the sake of your Son, our

Saviour Jesus Christ. Amen.

Please <u>sit</u>, as the Choir sing "God be in my Head" by Sir Henry Walford Davies (1869-1941), and bread and wine are brought to the altar.

<u>Stand</u> to sing hymn REH 156, as the altar is prepared and the collection is taken. If you want to give by card, there is a card reader at the back of church.

The Priest prays the Preface to the Eucharistic Prayer, and then all sing the Sanctus and Benedictus:

Blessed is he who comes in the name of the Lord.
Hosanna in the highest.

Please <u>kneel</u>. The Eucharistic Prayer continues, until the Words of Institution.

Then all make the Memorial Acclamation:

*Priest* Great is the mystery of faith.

People Save us, Saviour of the world, for by your cross and resurrection you have set us free.

The Priest concludes the Eucharistic Prayer, and all sing:

People Amen!

Please stand for the Lord's Prayer.

Priest At the Saviour's command, and formed by divine

teaching, we dare to sing,

People Our Father, who art in heaven

hallowed be thy name,

thy kingdom come, thy will be done;

on earth as it is in heaven.

Give us this day our daily bread.

And forgive us our trespasses

as we forgive those who trespass against us.

And lead us not into temptation;

but deliver us from evil.

*Priest* Deliver us, Lord, we pray, from every evil, graciously grant

peace in our day, that by the help of your mercy, we may be always free from sin and safe from all distress, as we await the blessed hope and the coming of our Saviour

Jesus Christ.

People For the kingdom, the power, and the glory are yours,

now and for ever.

Priest Lord Jesus Christ, who said to your apostles: Peace I leave

you, my peace I give you; look not on our sins, but on the faith of your Church, and graciously grant her peace and unity in accordance with your will. Who live and reign for

*Priest* Let us offer one another a sign of peace.

Now sing the Agnus Dei

People Lamb of God, you take away the sins of the world: have

mercy on us. (repeated)

Lamb of God, you take away the sins of the world: grant

us peace.

Then kneel.

Priest Behold the Lamb of God. Behold him who takes away the

sins of the world. Blessed are those called to the supper

of the Lamb.

People Lord, I am not worthy that you should enter under my

roof, but only say the word and my soul shall be healed.

Priest The disciples recognized the Lord Jesus in the breaking of

the bread, alleluia.

The people come forward to receive Communion. If you have not been baptized and confirmed, please come forward for a blessing instead of Communion, carrying this order of service.

During Communion hymn REH 390 is sung, all remaining <u>seated or kneeling</u>.

May the grace of Christ our Saviour, And the Father's boundless love, With the Holy Spirit's favour, Rest upon us from above.

Thus may we abide in union
With each other and the Lord,
And possess in sweet communion,
Joys which earth cannot afford.

To the God whose wisdom made us, To the Son who set us free, To the sanctifying Spirit, Glory, endless glory, be. Amen.
