This booklet contains all the material you will need for today's celebration of Mass. We hope that you will find this service easy to follow, but please do not be afraid to ask if you are unsure what to do at any point. The building is fitted with an induction loop and you will find the best results away from the pillars.

Families with small children are very welcome to make use of the carpeted play area at the back of church, where you will find books, crayons and soft toys. There are two further play stations in the side aisles. Older children should join Children's Church, who will go out to the Hall after the first hymn, and return in time for Communion.

A toilet is at the back of church, behind the screen. After Mass, please join us in the hall for refreshments. Before Mass, please try to maintain an atmosphere of quiet prayer.

Mass setting: Wood in the Phrygian Mode.

Please <u>stand</u> when the bell rings, for the procession of the clergy and servers, and to sing hymn 644, the Lent Prose:

Hear us, O Lord, have mercy upon us: for we have sinn'd against thee.

To thee, Redeemer, on thy throne of glory: lift we our weeping eyes in holy pleadings: listen, O Jesu, to our supplications.

O thou chief Corner-stone, Right Hand of the Father Way of Salvation, Gate of Life Celestial cleanse thou our sinful souls from all defilement. Hear us, O Lord, have mercy upon us:

God, we implore thee, in thy glory seated bow down and hearken to thy children pity and pardon all our grievous trespasses. Hear us, O Lord, have mercy upon us: for we have sinn'd against thee. The priest sings:

The priest introduces the Mass, sends Children's Church to their activities, and invites the people to recall and confess their sins:

Then the priest prays the collect:

Priest

O God, author of every mercy and of all goodness, who in fasting, prayer and almsgiving have shown us a remedy for sin, look graciously on this confession of our lowliness, that we, who are bowed down by our conscience, may always be lifted up by your mercy. Through our Lord Jesus Christ, your Son, who lives and reigns with you in the unity of the Holy Spirit, God, for ever and ever.

People Amen.

Now <u>sit</u> to listen to the first reading:

Reader

A reading from the book of Exodus. (Exodus 3; 1-8, 13-15) In those days: Moses was keeping the flock of his fatherin-law, Jethro, the priest of Midian, and he led his flock to the west side of the wilderness and came to Horeb, the mountain of God. And the angel of the Lord appeared to him in a flame of fire out of the midst of a bush. He looked, and behold, the bush was burning, yet it was not consumed. And Moses said, 'I will turn aside to see this great sight, why the bush is not burned.' When the Lord saw that he turned aside to see, God called to him out of the bush, 'Moses, Moses!' And he said, 'Here I am.' Then he said, 'Do not come near; take your sandals off your feet, for the place on which you are standing is holy ground.' And he said, 'I am the God of your father, the God of Abraham, the God of Isaac, and the God of Jacob.' And Moses hid his face, for he was afraid to look at God. Then the Lord said, 'I have surely seen the affliction of my people who are in Egypt and have heard their cry because of their taskmasters. I know their sufferings, and I have come down to deliver them out of the hand of the Egyptians and to bring them up out of that land to a good and broad land, a land flowing with milk and honey.' Then Moses said to God, 'If I come to the people of Israel and say to them, "The God of your fathers has sent me to you", and they ask me, "What is his name?" what shall I say to them?' God said to Moses, 'I Am Who I Am.' And he said, 'Say this to the people of Israel: "I Am has sent me to you." ' God also said to Moses, 'Say this to the people of Israel: "The Lord, the God of your fathers, the God of Abraham, the God of Isaac, and the God of Jacob, has sent me to you." This is my name for ever, and thus I am to be remembered throughout all generations.'

Remain seated for the second reading:

Reader A reading from the first letter of St Paul to the

Corinthians. (1 Corinthians 10; 1-6, 10-12)

I do not want you to be unaware, brothers and sisters, that our fathers were all under the cloud, and all passed through the sea, and all were baptised into Moses in the cloud and in the sea, and all ate the same spiritual food, and all drank the same spiritual drink. For they drank from the spiritual Rock that followed them, and the Rock was Christ. Nevertheless, with most of them God was not pleased, for they were overthrown in the wilderness.

Now these things took place as examples for us, that we might not desire evil as they did, nor grumble, as some of them did and were destroyed by the Destroyer. Now these things happened to them as an example, but they were written down for our instruction, on whom the end of the ages has come. Therefore let anyone who thinks that he stands take heed lest he fall.

Priest A reading from the holy Gospel according to Luke. (Luke 13;

1-9).

Priest There were some present at that very time who told Jesus

about the Galileans whose blood Pilate had mingled with their sacrifices. And he answered them, 'Do you think that these Galileans were worse sinners than all the other Galileans because they suffered in this way? No, I tell you; but unless you repent, you will all likewise perish. Or those eighteen on whom the tower in Siloam fell and killed them: do you think that they were worse offenders than all the others who lived in Jerusalem? No, I tell you; but unless you

repent, you will all likewise perish.'

And he told this parable: 'A man had a fig tree planted in his vineyard, and he came seeking fruit on it and found none. And he said to the vine dresser, "Look, for three years now I have come seeking fruit on this fig tree, and I find none. Cut it down. Why should it use up the ground?" And he answered him, "Sir, let it alone this year also, until I dig round it and put on manure. Then if it should bear fruit next year, well and good; but if not, you can cut it down." '

All <u>stand</u> to say the Nicene Creed:

People

I believe in one God, the Father almighty, maker of heaven and earth, of all things visible and invisible.

I believe in one Lord Jesus Christ, the Only Begotten Son of God, born of the Father before all ages. God from God, Light from Light, true God from true God, begotten, not made, consubstantial with the Father, through him all things were made. For us men and for our salvation he came down from heaven, and by the Holy Spirit was incarnate of the Virgin Mary, and became man. For our sake he was crucified under Pontius Pilate, he suffered death and was buried, and rose again on the third day in accordance with the Scriptures. He ascended into heaven, and is seated at the right hand of the Father. He will come again in glory to judge the living and the dead and his kingdom will have no end.

I believe in the Holy Spirit, the Lord, the giver of life, who proceeds from the Father and the Son, who with the Father and the Son is adored and glorified, who has spoken through the prophets. I believe in one holy, catholic and apostolic Church. I confess one Baptism for the forgiveness of sins and I look forward to the resurrection of the dead, and the life of the world to come. Amen.

Please remain standing for the Prayers of Intercession. The Priest introduces and concludes the prayers.

Priest

At the prayer for the departed,

Reader Rest eternal grant unto them, O Lord.

When the prayers of the saints are asked,

Hail, Mary, full of grace, the Lord is with thee. Blessed art thou among women, and blessed is the fruit of thy womb, Jesus: Holy Mary, Mother of God, pray for us sinners, now and at the hour of our death. Amen.

In conclusion to the prayers:

Priest Rejoicing, we commend ourselves and one another and all

for whom we pray to Christ our God: that God's mercy and compassion may descend upon us all to save and

defend us. Merciful Father,

People Accept these prayers for the sake of your Son, our

Please <u>sit</u>, as the Choir sing "Lord, for thy Tender Mercies' Sake", by Richard Farrant (c.1530-1580), and bread and wine are brought to the altar.

<u>Stand</u> to sing hymn 571, as the altar is prepared and the collection is taken. If you want to give by card, there is a card reader at the back of church.

The Priest prays the Preface to the Eucharistic Prayer, and then the Choir sing the Sanctus and Benedictus:

Blessed is he that cometh in the name of the Lord.

Hosanna in the highest.

Please kneel. The Eucharistic Prayer continues, until the Words of Institution.

Then all make the Memorial Acclamation:

Priest Great is the mystery of faith.

People Save us, Saviour of the world, for by your cross and

resurrection you have set us free.

The Priest concludes the Eucharistic Prayer, and all sing:

People Amen!

Please stand for the Lord's Prayer.

Priest At the Saviour's command, and formed by divine

teaching, we dare to say,

People Our Father, who art in heaven

hallowed be thy name,

thy kingdom come, thy will be done;

on earth as it is in heaven.

Give us this day our daily bread.

And forgive us our trespasses

as we forgive those who trespass against us.

And lead us not into temptation;

but deliver us from evil.

Priest Deliver us, Lord, we pray, from every evil, graciously grant

peace in our day, that by the help of your mercy, we may be always free from sin and safe from all distress, as we await the blessed hope and the coming of our Saviour

Jesus Christ.

People For the kingdom, the power, and the glory are yours,

now and for ever.

Priest Lord Jesus Christ, who said to your apostles: Peace I leave

The Choir sing the Agnus Dei

sins of the world. Blessed are those called to the supper

of the Lamb.

People Lord, I am not worthy that you should enter under my

roof, but only say the word and my soul shall be healed.

Priest The sparrow finds a home, and the swallow a nest for her

young: by your altars, O Lord of hosts, my King and my God. Blessed are they who dwell in your house, for ever

singing your praise.

The people come forward to receive Communion. If you have not been baptized and confirmed, please come forward for a blessing instead of Communion, carrying this order of service.

During Communion hymn 93 is sung, all remaining seated or kneeling.

Lord, on us thy Spirit pour, Kneeling lowly at the door, Lest it close for evermore.

By thy night of agony, By thy supplicating cry, By thy willingness to die.

Please <u>sit</u> for the notices.

Then <u>stand</u> for the blessing and dismissal

Priest The Lord be with you.

People And also with you.

Priest Direct, O Lord, we pray, the hearts of your faithful, and in

your kindness grant your servants this grace: that, abiding in the love of you and their neighbour, they may fulfil the

whole of your commands. Through Christ our Lord.

People Amen.

Priest May almighty God bless you, the Father, and the Son, and

the Holy Spirit.

People Amen.

Priest Go forth, the Mass is ended.

People Thanks be to God.

The clergy and servers go to the shrine of Our Lady for the Angelus:
