This booklet contains all the material you will need for today's celebration of Mass. We hope that you will find this service easy to follow, but please do not be afraid to ask if you are unsure what to do at any point. The building is fitted with an induction loop and you will find the best results away from the pillars.

Families with small children are very welcome to make use of the carpeted play area at the back of church, where you will find books, crayons and soft toys. There are two further play stations in the side aisles. Older children are very welcome to join the Children's Church, who go out to the Hall shortly after the service has started, and return before Communion.

A toilet is at the back of church, behind the screen. After Mass, please join us in the hall for refreshments. Before Mass, please try to maintain an atmosphere of quiet prayer.

Please <u>stand</u> when the bell rings, for the procession of the clergy and servers, and to sing hymn REH 229:

With golden splendour and with roseate hues of morn, O gracious Saviour, Light of light, this day adorn, Which brings to ransomed sinners hopes of that far home Where saints and angels sing the praise of martyrdom.

Peter keybearer, Paul the teacher of mankind, Lights of the world and judges sent to loose and bind, Alike triumphant or by cross and sword-stroke found, In life's high senate stand with victor's laurel crowned.

Good shepherd, Peter, unto whom the charge was given To close or open ways of pilgrimage to heaven, In sin's hard bondage held may we have grace to know The full remission thou wast granted to bestow.

The priest sings:

The priest introduces the Mass, sends Children's Church to their activities, and invites the people to recall and confess their sins:

- Priest As we celebrate the memory of the holy Apostles Peter and Paul, let us acknowledge our lack of faithfulness and devotion. So let us confess our sins.
- People I confess to almighty God and to you, my brothers and sisters, that I have greatly sinned, in my thoughts and in my words, in what I have done and in what I have failed to do, through my fault, through my fault, through my most grievous fault; therefore I ask blessed Mary evervirgin, all the angels and saints, and you, my brothers and sisters, to pray for me to the Lord our God.
- PriestMay almighty God have mercy on us, forgive us our sins,
and bring us to everlasting life,

People Amen.

Remain standing to sing the Kyries:

People Lord, have mercy. Lord, have mercy.Christ, have mercy. Christ, have mercy.Lord, have mercy. Lord, have mercy.

We all sing the Gloria.

People Glory to God in the highest, and peace to his people on earth. Lord God, heavenly King, almighty God and Father, we worship you, we give you thanks, we praise you for your glory. Lord Jesus Christ, only Son of the Father, Lord God, Lamb of God, you take away the sin of the world: have mercy on us; you are seated at the right hand of the Father: receive our prayer. For you alone are the Holy One, you alone are the Lord, you alone are the most high, Jesus Christ, with the Holy Spirit, in the glory of God the Father. Amen

Then the priest prays the collect:

Priest O God, who on the Solemnity of the Apostles Peter and Paul give us the noble and holy joy of this day, grant, we pray, that your Church may in all things follow the teaching of those through whom she received the beginnings of right religion. Through our Lord Jesus Christ, your Son, who lives and reigns with you in the unity of the Holy Spirit, God, for ever and ever.

People Amen.

Now <u>sit</u> to listen to the first reading:

Reader A reading from the Acts of the Apostles. (Acts 12; 1-11).
About that time King Herod laid violent hands upon some who belonged to the church. He had James, the brother of John, killed with the sword. After he saw that it pleased the Jews, he proceeded to arrest Peter also. (This was during the festival of Unleavened Bread.) When he

had seized him, he put him in prison and handed him over to four squads of soldiers to guard him, intending to bring him out to the people after the Passover. While Peter was kept in prison, the church prayed fervently to God for him.

The very night before Herod was going to bring him out, Peter, bound with two chains, was sleeping between two soldiers, while guards in front of the door were keeping watch over the prison. Suddenly an angel of the Lord appeared and a light shone in the cell. He tapped Peter on the side and woke him, saying, 'Get up quickly.' And the chains fell off his wrists. The angel said to him, 'Fasten your belt and put on your sandals.' He did so. Then he said to him, 'Wrap your cloak around you and follow me.' Peter went out and followed him; he did not realize that what was happening with the angel's help was real; he thought he was seeing a vision. After they had passed the first and the second guard, they came before the iron gate leading into the city. It opened for them of its own accord, and they went outside and walked along a lane, when suddenly the angel left him. Then Peter came to himself and said, 'Now I am sure that the Lord has sent his angel and rescued me from the hands of Herod and from all that the Jewish people were expecting.' This is the word of the Lord.



Remain seated for the second reading:

A reading from the second letter of St Paul to Timothy. (2 Reader Timothy 4; 6-8, 17-18) My life is already being poured away as a libration, and the time has come for me to be gone. I have fought the good fight to the end; I have run the race to the finish; I have kept the faith; all there is to come now is the crown of righteousness reserved for me, which the Lord, the righteous judge, will give to me on that Day; and not only to me but to all those who have longed for his Appearing. The Lord stood by me and gave me power, so that through me the whole message might be proclaimed for all the pagans to hear; and so I was rescued from the lion's mouth. The Lord will rescue me from all evil attempts on me, and bring me safely to his heavenly kingdom. To him be glory for ever and ever. Amen. This is the word of the Lord.

People Thanks be to God.

<u>Stand</u> for the gospel acclamation after a brief pause for reflection.

- *Priest* A reading from the holy Gospel according to Matthew. (*Matthew 16; 13-19*)

Priest When Jesus came to the region of Caesarea Philippi he put this question to his disciples, 'Who do people say the Son of Man is?' And they said, 'Some say he is John the Baptist, some Elijah, and others Jeremiah or one of the prophets.' 'But you,' he said 'who do you say I am?' Then Simon Peter spoke up, 'You are the Christ,' he said 'the Son of the living God.' Jesus replied, 'Simon son of Jonah, you are a happy man! Because it was not flesh and blood that revealed this to you but my Father in heaven. So I now say to you: You are Peter and on this rock I will build my Church. And the gates of the underworld can never hold out against it. I will give you the keys of the kingdom of heaven: whatever you bind on earth shall be considered bound in heaven; whatever you loose on earth shall be considered loosed in heaven.'

All <u>stand</u> to say the Nicene Creed:

People I believe in one God, the Father almighty, maker of heaven and earth, of all things visible and invisible.

> I believe in one Lord Jesus Christ, the Only Begotten Son of God, born of the Father before all ages. God from God, Light from Light, true God from true God, begotten, not made, consubstantial with the Father, through him all things were made. For us men and for our salvation he came down from heaven, and by the Holy Spirit was incarnate of the Virgin Mary, and became man. For our sake he was crucified under Pontius Pilate, he suffered death and was buried, and rose again on the third day in accordance with the Scriptures. He ascended into heaven, and is seated at the right hand of the Father. He will come again in glory to judge the living and the dead and his kingdom will have no end.

> I believe in the Holy Spirit, the Lord, the giver of life, who proceeds from the Father and the Son, who with the Father and the Son is adored and glorified, who has spoken through the prophets. I believe in one holy, catholic and apostolic Church. I confess one Baptism for the forgiveness of sins and I look forward to the resurrection of the dead, and the life of the world to come. Amen.

Please remain standing for the Prayers of Intercession.

People Hear our prayer. / Lord, graciously hear us.

At the prayer for the departed,

- *Reader* Rest eternal grant unto them, O Lord.
- *People* and let light perpetual shine upon them.

When the prayers of the saints are asked,

Hail, Mary, full of grace, the Lord is with thee. Blessed art thou among women, and blessed is the fruit of thy womb, Jesus: Holy Mary, Mother of God, pray for us sinners, now and at the hour of our death. Amen.

In conclusion to the prayers:

- *Priest* Bring us, Lord, and all for whom we pray, to sit at your table in your kingdom. Merciful Father,
- People Accept these prayers for the sake of your Son, our Saviour Jesus Christ. Amen.

Please <u>sit</u>, as the Choir sing "O Holy Spirit, Lord of Grace" by Christopher Tye (c.1505- before 1573), and bread and wine are brought to the altar.

<u>Stand</u> to sing hymn REH 287, as the altar is prepared and the collection is taken. If you want to give by card, there is a card reader at the back of church. Let the round world with songs rejoice, Let heaven return the joyful voice, All mindful of the apostles' fame, Let heaven and earth their praise proclaim.

Ye servants who once bore the light Of gospel truth o'er heathen night, Still may your work that light impart, To glad our eyes and cheer our heart.

O God, by whom to them was given The key that shuts and opens heaven, Our chains unbind, our loss repair, And grant us grace to enter there.

For at thy will they preached the word Which cured disease, which health conferred; O may thy healing power once more Our souls to grace and health restore. The Priest says

The Priest prays the Preface to the Eucharistic Prayer, and then all sing the Sanctus and Benedictus:

Please <u>kneel</u>. The Eucharistic Prayer continues, until the Words of Institution. Then all make the Memorial Acclamation:

Priest Great is the mystery of faith.

People Save us, Saviour of the world, for by your cross and resurrection you have set us free.

The Priest concludes the Eucharistic Prayer, and all sing:

People Amen!

Now sing the Agnus Dei

People Lamb of God, you take away the sins of the world: have mercy on us. (repeated)
Lamb of God, you take away the sins of the world: grant us peace.

Then <u>kneel.</u>

- *Priest* Behold the Lamb of God. Behold him who takes away the sins of the world. Blessed are those called to the supper of the Lamb.
- People Lord, I am not worthy that you should enter under my roof, but only say the word and my soul shall be healed.
- Priest Peter said to Jesus: You are the Christ, the Son of the living God. And Jesus replied: You are Peter, and upon this rock I will build my Church.

The people come forward to receive Communion. If you have not been baptized and confirmed, please come forward for a blessing instead of Communion, carrying this order of service.

During Communion hymn REH 371 is sung, all remaining <u>seated or kneeling</u>. Be still, for the presence of the Lord, The Holy One, is here; Come bow before him now With reverence and fear. In him no sin is found, We stand on holy ground; Be still, for the presence of the Lord, The Holy One, is here.

Be still, for the glory of the Lord Is shining all around; He burns with holy fire, With splendour he is crowned. How awesome is the sight, Our radiant King of light; Be still, for the glory of the Lord Is shining all around.

Be still, for the power of the Lord Is moving in this place; He comes to cleanse and heal, To minister his grace. No work too hard for him, In faith receive from him; Be still, for the power of the Lord Is moving in this place.
